About 69 per cent of the world's fresh water goes for irrigation, about 23 per cent for industry and 8 per cent for household use. In many arid and semi-arid areas, population growth has raised food demand to a level that can be met only through irrigation. Some countries lie within climatic zones most prone to drought and other water problems. Unfortunately, some of these countries have high rates of population growth. For example, the populations of Kenya, Ethiopia and Iran may well double within 25 years, yet the amount of water available to these countries will remain the same.

Even with efficient irrigation and other water-use methods, many countries in the Middle East and Africa may not be able to meet their water needs by 2025 if population growth continues at present levels. By that date, some believe that as many as 25 developing countries may have reached the water barrier, which is the minimum amount of water needed by each person, assuming access to advanced technology to maximize water conservation. Another 24 countries may experience seasonal shortages and problems with water quality.
